1. Read the following passage carefully:

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1. I came to California during spring; that alone was stressful. Then I discovered that academics here were much harder than back home. Add to this that I didn't know anyone and had trouble making friends. I was getting more anxious by the day, and I didn't know what to do. However, as time went by my shyness changed to excitement, and that excitement generated an adventurous spirit in me. I wanted to go out and explore Berkeley, and I was building up the courage to talk to more people.

2. I stayed in the dorms when I first arrived. Although most people on the floor had already formed their cliques, I'm still grateful to have lived there. I met people who introduced me to many clubs, classes, and activities that I might otherwise have missed out on.

3. Still, all the changes and challenges were really getting to me. I used to overeat when I was anxious, which didn't benefit my body at all my stomach would hurt, and then I'd be even more stressed that I didn't feel well! "Talking" to someone wasn't an idea that occurred to me until much later, when I learned that expressing my feelings might be a healthier (and less stomach-ache-inducing) way to relieve stress.

4. One of my first friends happened to be in the Health Worker Programme (HWP). She was so amazing! I felt like I finally found someone to talk to, someone who would listen to me. Eventually, by the end of my first semester at California, things started to look up. I made more friends, I adjusted to the academics at Berkeley, and I learned how to live in a city completely different from my hometown. I don't think I would have managed, though, if it had not been for my friend's empathetic nature and peer counselling training. My experience with her led me to become a health worker as well. When one thinks of health, many images come to mind; the flu, a cough, medicine. With my major being Linguistics (read: a social science!), I was very apprehensive about applying to such a programme. I quickly discovered, however, that being a health worker wasn't about playing doctor-it's about learning life skills (which I continue to use in my daily life, on and off campus) and becoming an advocate of health for your peers.


2.. Read the following passage carefully:

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1. We often think of TV watching as the activity where people are fully engaged and immersed in the TV programmes. However, research has shown that there is a continuum of levels of attention while watching TV.

2. All teenagers are different. But many enjoy spending their free time doing things like shopping, going to parties, being with friends, gaming and using social media, texting, watching movies, reading and going to the beach or park.
3. Teenagers are also spending an increasing amount of their T.V time in structured extracurricular activities like arts and sports. The given chart shows teenagers' answers to a survey for Notthem Ireland Teen Time magazine, which asked them if they do anything else while they watch TV. It can be seen that over three- quarters of those surveyed do other things simultaneously.

4. Over half said they either ate or checked their mobile phone or tablet while they were watching TV while, perhaps unsurprisingly, only a few teenagers said they read, did exercise or listened to music while watching TV. Eight per cent talked to their families and another 8% said they often did homework and watched TV at the same time. It is not clear from the pie chart if they did more than one additional activity at once. A large proportion of families watch TV while they are eating, while almost a third of young people divide their attention between several screens at the same time.
5. It was found that multitasking occurred almost 40% of the time when people were seated in front of the television. Most multitasking occurred during TV programmes not during the interval between TV programmes. Of the time people spent multitasking, 27% was spent on a device, mostly a smartphone. However, only 10% of device-related multitasking was related to the content being played on the TV. With our study, we contribute to the greater body of foundational knowledge around common multitasking behaviours that are conducted in front of the television.
6. These figures may reflect a general trend towards less formal family mealtimes and greater levels of multitasking. However, a significant number of teenagers still focus fully on the television when they are watching.


