1. Art:

Objective: Foster creativity, fine motor skills, and imagination.

Activity 1: Rainbow Fruit Basket

Task: Create a colourful fruit basket using paper and natural materials.

Instructions:

- Draw a basket on an A4 sheet.
- Cut out or draw 5 fruits (e.g., apple, banana, mango) from coloured paper or use fruit stickers.
- Paste them in the basket and colour the background with a rainbow pattern.
- Write the names of 5 fruits in English or Hindi below the basket.
- Materials Needed: A4 sheet, coloured paper, glue, crayons, scissors (child-safe).
- Submission: Bring the artwork to school.

Activity 2: My favourite Day Craft

Task: Make a craft showing your favourite day of the week.

Instructions:

- Choose one day (e.g., Sunday) and draw what you love doing on that day (e.g., playing, eating ice-cream).
- Use cotton, leaves, or glitter to decorate the drawing.
- Write the day's name in English and Hindi (e.g., Sunday/रविवार),
- Materials Needed: A4 sheet, crayons, glue, decorative items.
- Submission: Submit the craft to the teacher.

2. English (Vowels, Days of the Week, Colours, Use of He/She/This/That)

Objective: Build vocabulary, grammar, and speaking skills through playful and interactive tasks

Activity 1: Vowel Treasure Hunt

Task: Go on a vowel treasure hunt at home and create a vowel display

Instructions:

- Find 5 objects at home starting with vowels (e.g. A for Apple, E for Eraser, I for Ink, O for Orange, U for Umbrella).
- Draw each object on an A4 sheet or take a photo (with parent help) and stick it on the sheet.
- Write the vowel (capital and small, eg, A, a) and the object's name next to each drawing/photo.
- Practice saying, "This is an [object]. It starts with [vowel]."
- Materials Needed: A4 sheet, crayons, glue, camera/phone (optional),
- Submission: Submit the vowel display sheet to the teacher.

Activity 2: Days of the Week Mobile

Task: Create a hanging mobile of the days of the week with colours.

Instructions:

- Cut out 7 cloud shapes from paper (or use old cardboard).
- Write one day of the week (Monday to Sunday) on each cloud and colour it with a different colour eg, Monday-Red, Tuesday - Yellow).
- Attach the clouds to a hanger or string with parent help to make a mobile.
- Practice saying the days in order while pointing to each cloud.
- Materials Needed: Paper/cardboard, string, hanger, crayons, scissors (child-safe).
- Submission: Bring the mobile to school or submit a photo of it with a parent's note.

Activity 3: He / She Puppet Show

Task: Make finger puppets and use "He," "She," "This," and "That" in a mini puppet show.

Instructions:

- Draw and cut out 2 finger puppets (e.g., a boy and a girl) on paper, with holes for fingers to act as logs.
- Decorate the puppets with crayons or cloth scraps.
- Practice a short dialogue with the puppets, e.g.. "This is a boy. He is dancing. That is a girl. She is singing."
- Perform the puppet show for your family and write 2 sentences from the dialogue on an A4 sheet.
- Materials Needed: Paper, crayons, scissors, cloth scraps (optional).
- Submission: Bring the puppets and the written sentences to school,

3. Numeracy (Counting 1 to 200, Tables of 2 and 3, 4, 5)

Objective: Build number recognition, counting fluency, and multiplication basics

Activity 1: Number Wall (1 to 200)

Task: Create a number wall from 1 to 200

Instructions:

- Use 3-4 A4 sheets or a chart paper to write numbers 1 to 200 in rows (10 numbers per row).
- Circle every 10th number (10, 20, 30, etc.) with a red crayon.
- Practice counting aloud from 1 to 200 while pointing to each number.
- Submission: Submit the number wall to the teacher.

Activity 2: Multiplication Flower Garden

Task: Make a flower garden to learn tables of 2 and 3, 4, 5

Instructions:

- Draw 10 flowers on an A4 sheet.
- Write one multiplication fact from the table of 2 on flowers (eg. $2 \times 1 = 2$)
- Colour the flowers and practice reciting the tables aloud
- Submission: Bring the flower garden sheet to school

4. Hindi “आ” की मात्रा, इ की मात्रा, Days of the Week, Fruits in Hindi)

Objective: Enhance Hindi vocabulary, writing, and recognition of basic concepts.

Activity 1: आ की मात्रा और इ की मात्रा book

Task: Create a booklet for words with आ की मात्रा इ की मात्रा

Instructions:

- Fold 4 A4 sheets to make a booklet.
- Write 5 words with आ की मात्रा (eg. गाए, साप, खाना) and words with इ की मात्रा .
ममला, फिर)
- Draw a picture for each word next to it.
- Practice reading the words aloud.
- Submission: Submit the booklet to the teacher.

Activity 2: Days and Fruits Poster

Task: Make a poster of days of the week in Hindi and fruit names,

Instructions:

- Draw a table on an A4 sheet with 7 rows for days (सोमवार, मंगलवार, बुधवार, गुरुवार, शुक्रवार, शनिवार, रविवार)
- Write one fruit name in Hindi next to each day eg. सोमवार- सेब, मंगलवार-केला).
- Colour the poster and practice saying the days and fruit names aloud
- Submission: Bring the poster to school

5. Literacy (Story Activity)

Objective: Develop reading, comprehension, and speaking skills.

Activity 1: My Animal Story

Task: Create and share a short story about an animal

Instructions:

- Choose an animal (e.g., elephant, dog) and listen to or read a short story about it with a parent.
- Draw a picture of the animal doing something fun (e.g. "The elephant is spraying water")
- Write or dictate 2-3 sentences about the story (eg. "This is an elephant. He is big. He likes water.")
- Practice telling the story to a family member.
- Submission. Submit the drawing and sentences to the teacher.

Activity 2: Rhyme and Draw

Task: Learn and illustrate a rhyme.

Instructions:

- Choose a simple rhyme (e.g. "Baa Baa Black Sheep").
- Write the first 4 lines of the rhyme on an A4 sheet.
- Draw a picture related to the rhyme (e.g. a sheep)
- Recite the rhyme with actions for your family.
- Submission: Submit the written rhyme and drawing, and recite it for the teacher.

6. Life Skills

Objective: Promote independence, responsibility, and social etiquette.

Activity 1: My Responsibility Diary

Task: Keep a diary of 5 tasks you do to help at home.

Instructions:

- Choose 5 tasks (e.g, making your bed, helping with dishes, saying "Thank You?)
- Draw a table on an A4 sheet with 7 columns (one for each day) and 5 rows (one for each task)
- Put a smiley face or sticker in the box when you complete a task each day
- Show the diary to your parents dally.
- Submission: Bring the diary to school

Activity 2: Button and Zip Practice

Task: Learn to button a shirt or zip a bag

Instructions:

- Practice buttoning a shirt or zipping a bag for 5 minutes' daily
- Ask a parent to guide you initially.
- Draw a picture of a shirt or bag on an A4 sheet and write, "I can button/zip"
- Ask a parent to write a note confirming you practiced this skill.
- Submission: Submit the drawing and note to the teacher.

Evaluation Criteria

- Creativity and Engagement Originality and enthusiasm in art, English, and story activities.
- Accuracy: Correct writing of letters, numbers, and words.
- Neatness: Clean and organized presentation of work.
- Skill Development: Improvement in counting, reading, writing, and life skills.

Note for Parents:

- Encourage your child to enjoy these activities with a sense of curiosity and fun.
- Ensure a safe environment for crafts and life skills tacks
- Reach out to the class teacher for any clarifications.
